## **COGECO PARTNERS WITH SOCCER**

**Hamilton – Ron Foxcroft**, Honorary Chair of the Field for All Seasons Campaign, along with Ancaster Soccer Club and Redeemer University College, announce two major contributions to the build the soccer dome.

Cogeco was one of the first companies to step forward and make a gift to build a new domed facility. Today they presented \$25,000 to the campaign.

“Congratulations to the Ancaster Soccer Club and Redeemer University College for their creative collaboration in realizing this magnificent ‘Field for All Seasons’ which furthers the opportunities for sporting development of so many children and youths in our community,” said Maureen Tilson Dymnt, Senior Director, Programming & Community Relations – Ontario for Cogeco. “As a committed community player and supporter, Cogeco saw a natural connection as a partner in this initiative, and we are thrilled with the result.”

The Field for All Seasons Campaign is a partnership project between Ancaster Soccer Club and Redeemer University College to address the need for soccer infrastructure in Hamilton. The \$4.8 million campaign will raise the funds needed to renovate the existing Redeemer field and build a new 4-season international-sized field with field house that will allow for exponential and strategic growth in programming and provide world class facilities that will attract players and teams from across Hamilton and south west Ontario.

In addition to celebrating the partnership with Cogeco, it was announced that Ancaster Soccer Club is making a leadership financial contribution to the building project.

“We want to change the game of soccer in Hamilton,” said John Kimpton, Vice President, Ancaster Soccer Club. “. To do that, to take soccer to the next level, we need world-class facilities. Our club is leading the way by committing \$475,000 to build the dome.”

With today’s announcements, the total raised for the campaign is just over \$3,227,000.

Currently, more than 28,000 youth are registered to play in soccer leagues across the city. In Canada, there are nearly 250,000 more players registered in soccer than hockey.
